According to Eliseo Acevedo and Juan Carlos Giron, contracts are not available for the general public. Acevedo as well as Alvaro Pardo explain that they are protected by a constitutional right that aims at protecting entrepreneurial secrecy and contracts have specific confidentiality clauses. According to Acevado, such confidentiality is protected especially regarding technical aspects of the contract.

Peer Review Comments:

Although as explained by the researcher contracts are protected by a constitutional right and are not available for the general public, the Agencia Nacional de Hidrocarburos publishes information related to them including aspects such as the name of the contractor, date of signature, type of contract, block area, duration of phase 1 and commitments.

Moreover, the Agreement 04, 2012 of the ANH was approved and specifies in its article 3, 3.10. Publicity: "(...) The contractual performance of ANH will be public and the records containing them will be open to the public, excepting those aspects or subjects protected by the law or contractually subject to confidentiality".

1.2.008 Environmental and social impact assessments

1.2.008.a: Does legislation require that mining, gas and oil development projects prepare an environmental impact assessment prior to the award of any mineral rights or project implementation?

Comments:

The legislation requires an environmental permit before project implementation, not before the award of rights. To obtain such permits, companies need to elaborate an environmental impact assessment and an environmental management plan. However, some environmental experts complain about the low quality of EIAs and environmental management plans.

The Decree 1220, 2005 was repealed by Decree 2820 from August 5th 2010. Article 52: this decree is valid from its publication in the official journal and repeals Decree 1220, 2005 and Decree 500, 2006.

Decree 2820, 2010 "which regulates the Title VIII of Law 99, 1993 concerning environmental licenses". Title III: Environmental Studies; includes Environmental Assessment of Alternatives and Environmental Impact Assessment. Article 18: Enforceability of the Environmental Assessment of Alternatives

Law 99, 1993: creates the Ministry of the Environment, rearranges the Public Sector responsible for the management and conservation of the environment and renewable natural resources, organizes the National Environmental System, SINA, and other provisions.

Resolution 1503, 2010 "adopts the general methodology for submission of environmental studies and other determinations are made"

1.2.008.b: Are environmental impact assessments for oil, gas and mining projects published by the authority in charge of regulating the sector and is there a consultation process?

Score: (A) B C D E

Comments:

According to article 15 of Decree 2820, companies need to inform communities about projects they are implementing, their impacts and the measures that will be taken to deal with them. Companies will determine if inputs received can be incorporated on the assessment.

There is also the opportunity for the environmental authorities or the communities to ask for environmental public audiences in order to discuss such studies and the corresponding plans. In general, for important and big size projects such audiences are organized. However, more than a consultation process these events are designed for the company to present the information and fulfill the requirement. But communities often complain about the lack of opportunity for them to introduce their concerns. In some cases, many people who are not related to the project seem to be invited to minimize the scope of complains or interrupt the speeches of some opposing leaders from the communities.

The regulatory agency (Agencia Nacional de Hidrocarburos -ANH) is ruled by a Board of Directors that includes the Mining and Energy Minister, the Finance Minister, the director of the National Planning Department and two representatives of the President. They must approve the directives to be taken into account by the agency; when the regulations of the sector activities are stated by law, the agency cannot deviate from them. Such Board defines policies, plans and guidelines to manage, award and monitor oil and gas contracts. (Law Decree 1760, 2003; Law-Decree 4137, 2011).

However, corruption scandals had emerged concerning the management of the oil revenues collected by the ANH. Others have also denounced the lack of deep analysis in the licensing round 2010.

Such lack of information can result in inadequate decision-making process as the one highlighted by the article of La Silla Vacía that indicates how a company obtained five blocks within the ANH round in 2010. According to the article, the contracts were not signed because the ANH discovered the links between the company and the front mean of a recognized drug dealer.

A researcher conducting a study in the mining sector also found it difficult to know who were behind the companies holding the mining titles in Colombia.

But there is no important debates around this particular issue in Colombia.



An agreement of the ANH establishes that no economical rights will be paid by Ecopetrol apart from the one derived of high prices. I'm not sure if in economical rights they also include acreage fees. I'm waiting for a response.

The economical rights include payment for the use of sub-soil and sub-surface, not for soil (acreage) See journal "The Oil Economy in Colombia 2012" p. 33.
